Family Feud Points - The points are based on the commonality or relevance of the answer, with more common or primary answers receiving higher points.

Study Guide for Family Feud Game

Read the below scriptures for the basic story information, and the Family Feud game will ask questions in feud style over rounds with teams, with a final round by the two highest scoring teams from the first rounds.

1. James 1-5
2. Galatians 1-6
3. Romans 1-16
4. Genesis 39-50
5. Habakkuk 1-3
6. Daniel 1-10
7. 1 Samuel 8-31
8. 1 Kings 19-20

Rules for Family Feud Game

Overview:

- **Total Time:** 70 minutes
- **Teams:** 6 teams
- **Rounds:** 3 sets of initial rounds (2 rounds per pair of teams), followed by a final round between the top 2 highest-scoring teams.
- **Final Round:** The two highest-scoring teams from the initial rounds compete in one final round.

Game Structure:

1. **Initial Rounds:**
 - **Three Sets of Two Pairs:**
 - Teams are divided into pairs, with each pair facing off for two rounds.
 - **Set 1:** Team A vs. Team B
 - **Set 2:** Team C vs. Team D
 - **Set 3:** Team E vs. Team F
 - **Rounds Per Set:** Each set of teams will play 2 rounds, totaling 6 rounds across the initial matches.

- **Scoring:** Points are accumulated across the two rounds for each pair of teams.

2. Final Round:

- **Top 2 Teams:** After all initial rounds are complete, the two teams with the highest total scores across all sets advance to the final round.
- **Single Round:** The final round consists of one round to determine the overall winner.

Rules:

1. Team Setup:

- **Team Members:** Each team should have 3-5 members.
- **Roles:** Each team elects a captain who will provide the final answers. Other members can discuss and suggest answers.

2. Initial Rounds (Sets of Two Pairs):

- **Time Per Round:** Each round should last approximately 7-8 minutes.
- **Question Format:**
 - The host asks a question from the round's set (e.g., "Name a trial or difficulty that James says believers will face").
 - Teams take turns answering, starting with the team that won the coin toss or draw.
 - If a team gives an answer not on the list or repeats a previous answer, they receive a strike.
 - Each team has up to three strikes per round.
- **Scoring:**
 - Teams earn points based on the popularity of their correct answers.
 - After each question, the host announces the points earned.
 - The round ends when all possible answers are given, or both teams have accumulated three strikes.

3. Scoring and Advancing to the Final Round:

- **Score Calculation:** After the initial three sets of rounds (6 total rounds), the scores for each team are tallied.
- **Top Two Teams:** The two teams with the highest cumulative scores from the initial rounds advance to the final round.

4. Final Round:

- **One Final Round:** The two highest-scoring teams play one round to determine the overall winner.

- **Same Rules Apply:** The same rules from the initial rounds apply (e.g., strikes, taking turns, and scoring).

5. Tie-Breakers:

- **Tie in Initial Rounds:** If two teams tie for a position to advance to the final round, a sudden-death question will be asked. The team with the correct or higher-scoring answer advances.
- **Tie in Final Round:** If there is a tie in the final round, a sudden-death question will determine the winner.

6. Timing and Pacing:

- **Host's Role:** The host is responsible for keeping the game on schedule, ensuring each round moves quickly, and managing the scoring.
- **Strict Timekeeping:** Each team must answer within a short, specified time (e.g., 10 seconds) to keep the game within the 70-minute timeframe.

7. Winning and Prizes:

- **Overall Winner:** The team that wins the final round is declared the overall champion.
- **Prizes (Optional):** Consider awarding a prize to the winning team to add extra motivation and excitement.

Suggested Time Breakdown:

- **Introduction and Setup:** 5 minutes
- **Initial Rounds:** 45 minutes (approximately 15 minutes per set of two rounds)
- **Final Round:** 10 minutes
- **Wrap-Up and Announcement of Winner:** 5-10 minutes

This structure allows for an engaging and competitive Family Feud game while ensuring that all six teams participate and that the game fits within the 70-minute time limit.
